Students who are successful in applying to the Summer School will be provided an academic mentor from our student ambassador team. ## **QMUL SAVANT Summer School**

The Summer School is an exciting opportunity for students to join the team on campus during the first week of the school holidays, where they will be introduced to designing and running a language experiment.

The project aims to have students feel capable of running a complex neurolinguistic experiment including using EEG to record brain activity. Students will recruit participants from their family or friends who speak languages other than English for the experiment. Students will then be able to return to campus with their participants throughout summer to complete their research on a flexible basis.

We also invite A-Level teachers to join the students at the start of the Summer School and will provide bursaries to cover the cost of travel, food, etc. for all students, teachers and guests.
